

SUBJECT REQUIREMENTS

3. ASSESSMENT AND EVALUATION OF THE LEARNING OUTCOMES

3.1. General rules

- Evaluation of learning outcomes listed in section 2.2 is made through three written midterm tests, followed by an oral examination to be held in the examination period.
- Final grade will be calculated upon the two best test scores out of the three with equal weight.
- Each test is written in 45 minutes.

3.2. Assessment methods

3.3. Evaluation system

3.4. Requirement and validity of signature

- A student gets a signature and can be allowed for examination if the average result of the two best test scores is not less than 50%.
- Signatures obtained in past semesters preserve their validity upon re-registration for the subject but old scores will be overridden by current ones.

3.5. Grading system

- Results for students meeting attendance requirements are determined as follows.
- There is no requirement for tests to be successful.
- Midterm grade is evaluated upon the two best scores.
- Examinations with a result under 50% are unsuccessful, final grade is "Failed" (without respect to the midterm results).
- Final grades with a successful oral examination are evaluated upon the weighted average A of results of the two best tests and the examination as indicated in section 3.3:

Average	grade
$80\% \leq A$	5 (Excellent)
$70\% \leq A < 80\%$	4 (Good)
$60\% \leq A < 70\%$	3 (Satisfactory)
$50\% \leq A < 60\%$	2 (Passed)
$A < 50\%$	1 (Failed)

3.6. Retake and repeat

- Tests cannot be repeated in the subject.
- There is no second repetition of tests in the subject.
